

The Lost Colony Hunks

Some women find their eyeful at a bar; others on the beach. But an oft-overlooked veritable hotbed of male pulchritude is just across the bridge on Roanoke Island every night (except Sunday) from June through September.

The Hunks of the Lost Colony make you wonder how Queen Elizabeth I ever made it as the "Virgin Queen."

Traditionally, actors are in superb shape all the time barring some cases such as Dom DeLuise. And for these hunks, tramping around in sand for three hours a night is bound to help more than hinder.

So it is little wonder that the men wandering around backstage prior to the nightly performance provide a pleasing vista to the female eye.

Sweat pours off their biceps and foreheads as they move the ship into position, crank the winches, lift that barge and tote that bale in order to get the show ready by 8:00.

It's a wunnerful view, you know.

Of course, the roles they have are primarily due to the bodies that they have. While being able to perform convincingly and speak well is very important, the Lost Colony is largely visual and these men make that sweeping drama a bit more pleasing to the eye.

As one said when asked if he felt his excellent physique helped him land the roles he wished, "looks help alot if that's the commodity...however, looks and styles change with the wind.

Hundreds of women view these men nightly. The percentages are good that out of those hundreds, some will get a

or run into an interested female standing at the top of the hill, waiting. And the percentages win out.

Several of these hunks have received notes from a pleased audience member. One has even received a letter from five women in Raleigh.

A few have had come-ons not particularly for their good looks (though they do help) but because of the fact that they were actors or with a certain acting company.

The fact that they know that there are literally displaying their "goods' for all those women each night brings varying reactions. Some feel a bit nervous when they realize it; others get a "rush" from it.

"When you catch a glimpse of an attractive lady in the first few rows...it inspires you to perform a little harder...it gives you something to play for."

"A lot of times, there's girls, around 12 or 13, who wait after the show to meet us," but nothing much more serious than that.

Offstage, these manly figures do not follow the traditional roles. A few are full-time actors; in school or pursuing the elusive dream of fame. But others are involved in such non-hunk activities as real estate and teaching.

One could view their roles as Lost Colony Hunks as a parallel to the "chorus gir!"

Spotlight On The Colony Hunks

It was a difficult matter to choose who to spotlight as Lost Colony Hunks But with a cast of over 150, choices must be made. Here are a few that represent the "essence" of the Lost Colony Hunks.

BOBBY HAWK

Bobby understudies as Chief Manteo (Bob Midgette) and is also one of the Indians you see each night hanging off the totem pole.

Muscular, standing six feet tall with blue eyes and blonde hair, Bobby is also into stuntwork. He was trained by James Wilburn, stunt coordinator for Universal Studios and Steve Loughran, a professional stuntman and movie extra.

For this strenous work, he must keep in good shape and some of the ways he maintains his status as a "bunk" include karate, weightlifting, waterskiing, com collecting (keeps the fingers nimble), rock music (ears must be as in tune as the bod) and sleeping, a very important part of any fitness program.

In his first season as a Lost Colony Hunk, he says that "outdoor theatre is my favorite type of theatre, since it is so unpredictable. Also, I've always wanted to be in this show."

Well, Bobby got his wish. Bobby, a native of Circleville, Ohio, appears on the totem pole along with his brother David and other hunks portrayed here.



JEFF JEFFCOAT

Jeff's a kinda shy guy but still the epitome of what most women classify as "hunk material." He is understudying the role of Sir Walter Raleigh (Tom Whyte) and performs as an actor/technician.

Besides maintaining his physique, Jeff is an excellent guitarist and has been a d.j. at WVVA-FM at the University of Alabama for the past school year. He hails from Mobile, Ala. Jeff says that since he was an only child "my imagination has enabled me to act all my life; it feels natural.

Jeff is a potential 1985 graduate from the University of Alabama with a major in broadcast and minor in theatre.

ROBERT MIDGETTE

With piercing blue eyes and a true hunk in a hunk role, Bob plays Chief Manteo and has for four years. He has been with the Lost Colony for a total of 13 years.

A native of Roanoke Island, Bob teaches physical education at Manteo Middle School during the

winters. He keeps his manly figure by running, lifting weights and playing basketball in the Dare County Recreation League during the winters because "I can't show up 30 pounds overweight to play this role at the beginning of the summer. They just wouldn't hire me back."

A graduate of Atlantic Christian College with a B.S. in Physical Education, he is extremely conscious of his appearance for one major reason-to play Chief Manteo during the summer.

Bob also enjoys weight training during the winter. He has played in previous years with the Colony Thomas Archard, Red Soldier and was an actor/technician.

Another said it was rare for him to think of the audience as people; when he is on stage, he becomes immersed in his role and seldom thinks of the impression he is making.

One gets the impression after talking with these men awhile, that the

term "hunk" really never occurred to them before. They are conscious of their appearance-but not out of vanity but out of a dedication to their art they have chosen.


They are serious about their roles at the Lost Colony and dedicated to putting everything they have into it.

Stunt work is his major forte in the acting field and he received the same training his brother did from stunt coordinator for Universal James Winburn and Steve Loughran, stuntman. His specialties are high falls, fight scenes, explosives, stairway falls, horseback riding and archery.

David has a movie credit on his record—a hoodlum in the MGM movie "Teachers" with Nick Nolte and Judd Hirsch. The movie is scheduled for a September release.

Stunt work is physically demanding, so you can imagine why David's physique qualifies him as a Lost Colony Hunk. Among others, he water skis and swims as a hobby and to help keep his body in tip-top condition.

For his mind's fitness, he likes to study Indian culture and collects rare beer cans.

This is his second year with the Colony and claims gymnastics and capabilities.


fencing among his other "hunk" activities.

He is definitely not a small actor, with a body like his, and he keeps in shape with body building exercises and keeping up his fencing





